Bar Opening Extension – Nat's is hoping to extend the Bar opening hours to include Thursday from 2 – 7pm and perhaps Wednesday and Friday an hour earlier from 4pm. All of this, of course, is dependent on getting Bar staff! If you are a new member and you have indicated that this is an area in which you are willing to help then please do come forward. Please be aware that we will be chasing new members to keep their commitments on their application forms as just one hour would be very helpful – and we will talk you through what needs to be done and stay with you until you are happy.

Bar Staff – on a slightly different note, we would like to remind members that whoever is "on duty" behind the Bar is in charge of that area, of the stock, of the till, and if you wish to join him/her for whatever reason that you must ask. This is not an area where you can just help yourself to a drink because there is a queue. If there is a queue, ask if you can help by serving or just wait. I always ask "Permission to come on board!" Easy.

Card Payment for Membership – this is advance warning of a cost that will come into effect for the new Membership year from April 2024 when payment by card for Social or Full membership will incur a 2% charge. This is due to the fees incurred by PYC this year using the card system but, please be aware that payment by cash, cheque or BACS will not be affected.


or sausage buttie ??????? so do get your money in now!
