Dear Steven and Kevin,


I hope that your clubs are both having a great season on and off the water in 2023. I am your race officer for the Tythe Barn Trophy hosted at FSC this year and look forward to welcoming your members to the race next Sunday, 3rd September. The warning signal will be at 10:55 for an 11:00 start.

The race will be run from a committee boat, to allow us to set an accurate, pre-arranged course whatever the wind direction. I have attached a photograph of what the course will be, I'd be very grateful if this could be circulated to all prospective competitors to make the logistics on the day simpler.

The race will be run on average lap time basis, as we are likely to have a very wide range of boats taking part so we will be looking for a target race time of 60 minutes with boats then finishing as they complete their next lap. Flag S (blue square / white background) will be displayed on the committee boat along with 2 sound signals as the first boats to finish round mark 4.

If you could email me, no later than 0900 on the Sunday, the details of your competitors including Helm, Crew, Boat Class and Sail Number that would be greatly appreciated and will negate the need to come ashore to sign on.
