

What I cannot emphasize enough is that parents will always have total responsibility for their children whilst they are on the PYC premises, whether or not it involves the Family Room, unless they are engaged in organised sailing events. As always, the Family Room is still primarily a Training Room and if it is needed to be used as such, then it will be closed as a Family Room for that period.

Bar
