David our Treasurer, has done more sterling work and the new till with its own card reader is now up and running. We still have a few Bar volunteers who need training on it but, it is a simple process that only takes 10 minutes. The old till will remain in place in case of emergencies but is not to be used until this happens!

Pizza

Oh yes, we may be back soon on the ordering process! Watch out for Sam's messages on our various WhatsApp inviting you to place an order. Don't do anything unless you see an invite to say its open as it's half term at the moment and she does have other mouths to feed!!! Don't we all!

AGM

I'm really pleased to let you know that the vacancies on the Candidates for Election to Committee are now filling! There are still one or two gaps – the main one being for a Bar Manager.

I'm sure I've told you this before but, if you are interested, this is a role that can be shared. Basically, the Bar Manager shall:

- Keep the Bar stocked appropriately with varied barrelled beers and other drinks and snacks and use agreed suppliers
- Undertake a quarterly stock-take (with help)
- Manage the Till, float and banking
- Provide an update to the Management Committee meeting
- Maintain a Bar rota and encourage members to undertake duties
- Chair the Wine Committee
- Liaise with reps to obtain good deals for sundries ie glasses, umbrellas etc
- Ensure Gas stock orders are made
- Manage the pipe cleaning team

This is a role that can be split and I'm sure it would not be a problem to find a member to do the Bar rota and managing the Till, float and banking. I used to do this when the Commodore was the Bar Manager before taking on his current role.

If you are someone who is willing, or keen to keep an eye on the stock, this would involve routinely checking during the week what is being used, popping down to Bookers for certain drinks and snacks when we are getting low, contacting our

suppliers weekly to order beers/lagers and some spirits. It may very occasionally include contacting the supplier for Gas which is routinely delivered. That might involve if for some reason, we are running low - that would normally be a big event when sales of a particular beer were huge.

The other weekly responsibility is to ensure that stock is moved from the "cage" on delivery to the cellar and, that it is routinely moved from the cellar onto the Bar shelves to ensure that volunteers are not faced with empty shelves when it gets busy.

Anything else that you can see that you are not keen on – perhaps undertaking a quarterly stock-take, or providing an update to the Management Committee or Chairing a Wine Committee, then please accept that you would be always well supported by other members of the Committee and, if you wish to mostly give a written report, then that would be understood.

The other role that it would be great to see filled is the Rear Commodore Planning. This role since its inception has only been filled once and is now really so important when we are looking at moving the Club forward. The role of RC Planning is to:

- Support the Commodore to further develop and implement the club 5-Year Plan
- Oversee any supporting 5-Year Plan documentation
- Establish realistic timelines for each element of the 5-Year Plan
- Work with the committee and any sub-committees to ensure all officers are proactively engaged in the programme
- Provide updates to the Trustees, Committee & Membership on delivery of the 5-Year plan

Although the purpose of the role sounds a bit vague talking about a 5-Year Plan, it is really important and is to support the Commodore and the other members of the Committee to ensure that the Club is moving in a good direction that is approved by all and by the Trustees. I can't emphasize how important this role is – and we do need to fill it, please!

The only other important role that we have been sadly lacking in is a Press and Communication Officer. This isn't a voting role on the Committee but if you have a background in presenting information and demonstrating what is positive then we would welcome your help in approaching local and wider news agencies or schools with both pictures and advance notice of what we are up to. Don't forget that we have a huge amount of housing about to open who don't know anything about us. At the moment we are doing nothing! When you look at some of the photos of our sailing and other issues that are amazing – isn't that sad? We can provide the photos if you can provide the input.

On another note, I haven't received any information from our members regarding any business that they wish to be raised at the AGM. If you are unsure about this, please be aware that I must receive specifics in writing, with your full details including your membership number on the envelope addressed to me before **10am 29**th **October**. This can be handed to me or posted in the main outside post box at the Club. I will be checking the post box at that time.

Another reminder that 10am on **29**th **October** is the closing date for Candidates for Election to Committee and I will be taking the notice down at that time. As I have said, the last date for any business a member may request to be discussed at the AGM has to be made in writing to the Hon Sec by this date.
