

Mulberry

Now that we are fast approaching Armistice Day on 11th November, you may be interested to read more about Pagham during the wartime and why we have the one of the Mulberry structures on our shoreline.

Do have a look at http://www.relaysystem.co.uk/1944 Pagham at War.pdf which tells you more about the Phoenix Caissons, 48 of which were towed to an offshore location between Pagham and Selsey. The total number of these manufactured was 147 in numerous locations along the south coast and the Thames estuary and the codename for this exercise was Mulberry. They formed part of the plans for the D- Day landing to make Mulberry Harbours to ensure the supply of food, goods and ammunition on the French coastline for our men, vehicles and tanks.

The design by British engineers, how they managed to transport the Mulberry Harbours A and B to Arromanches and St. Laurent on the coastline of France is fascinating. Do have a look and spend time reading what actually happened as this is something so close to us and does involve the real Pagham Harbour before it was silted up, with Hawker Typhoons practicing firing dummy rockets at a small ship there. Quite a bit different to what we see today.

We are surrounding by amazing history that perhaps we are not even aware of. Well worth having a look.
