
Hi Everybody,

AGM

I'm pleased to say that we had a really good turn out with 44 members attending our AGM on Sunday. You now have a slightly different Management Committee with four new members on board:-

Jenna Ridgway as Safeguarding & Welfare Officer (was Lesley Haynes)
Stuart Ashwood as RC Sailing (was Kevin Mason who is now Bosun)
Mike Naish as RC Planning, filling a vacant position





There were only two main proposals that were put before the members; one was for £4,500 for purchase of a replacement container for the Boat Park. Once it was established that this included the amount to remove the rusty container and the cost of a crane to lift the replacement into the area, the proposal was accepted.

Two other proposals to increase the amount for supplementary systems for the solar panels and for the contingency to help encourage youth and family members were put on hold and withdrawn from this meeting.

The proposal for Honorary Membership for Andy Grout received enormous support from all! I'm told we don't need to call him Your Honour – just Sir will do!

There was a good deal of discussion regarding the subscription and fees for 2024/25 which included Membership fees for social members. Following conversations regarding former sailors and anglers who are now social members, it was noted that future consideration of any category will take this into account.

Unfortunately, following the AGM we are still without a Bar Manager and, although we have seen a huge improvement in the numbers of members who have come forward to do Bar duties (well done to all and everybody who have stepped forward !!!) we are now considering looking to go back to forming a Bar Committee to run it - unless we have a member comes forward soon. I hasten to add that this is not the Wine Committee as that is a totally different setup.

The Bar Committee was the means of how it was run in the past, before the role of Bar Manager was created, with individuals with skills in certain areas taking these on - but acting together as one unit. We have already heard from one member who has experience in the pub trade who could help with stock control – to ensure that we have enough of certain drinks but that we don't over stock or buy ones that won't sell etc. That is vital!

We will also need a person who can put it in his/her diary to talk to our Molson Coors rep for the beer needed on a weekly or monthly basis to order more, depending on how busy we have been or if we have an event coming up? Are you a forward planner who could deal with this as you would have lots of advice about how much was needed?

So, is there an area where you feel you would like to contribute your talents or efforts? Perhaps you are retired, or in a job where you are free a couple of mornings or afternoons and wouldn't mind popping down to Bookers to do some shopping for certain items such as cans of coke or Fanta that we are getting low on stock of? You could do this at the weekend or on your way home from work!

Or perhaps, just coming into the Bar and filling the shelves and refrigerators up with stock from the Cellar before it is open to ensure we have enough stock. That could happen at any time during the day, even when the Bar will not be open on that day in preparation for when Bar staff come in. I say "just" but that means you tell the Committee that we are running out of Coke or Fanta and the person who is doing the Bookers run knows what to purchase. Working as a team!
