All of that changed when we bought the new beach clubhouse in 1976 which was officially opened on 28th May 1977 with a Gala evening, Disco and Beach Supper underneath a Marquee. Oh – and we applied for a bar licence as well and that was successful. Not a lot has changed over the years and we do hope that you will join us to celebrate how our planned modifications will allow us to carry on providing sailing, fishing, paddleboarding and all sorts of activities for our members.

I am aware that our neighbours have now chosen - quite rightly, to now use this May Bank Holiday weekend for their own Charity fundraising events. Such a shame that it has to be the same date. Oh well, never mind....

Blog


