

#### **AGM**

For new members, as the minutes are not agreed until the next AGM they will not be displayed until they are agreed and signed. Sorry about that but I didn't make the rules.

## **Other Appointments**

**Auditor:** This was a proposal from the Committee and the Trustees to change to an external independent examination of the Club's books to ensure that now are going in the correct direction as we have changed our recording of data from paper and the direction of the Club's finance etc. Matthew Hanton of Aldwick, were appointed

For 38 Full plus 9 proxy = 47. Against 8 Full plus 2 proxy = 10

The Commodore praised the work by Simon Tomsett over many years who had been acting as our Auditor and said that this was not a reflection on the valuable work that he had done for the Club – that he had stepped in at a point in the beginning years ago to retrieve the Club from bad or non- auditing. This had not been forgotten and he could see that his valuable knowledge would be called on and used again if he was still willing to help out.

President of the Club (Five years from Nov 24): Edward Chantry - All agreed including 11 proxy votes.

**Vice President** (Annually): All agreed including 11 proxy votes. Terry did say that after all his years as a member, although he is now a Social member, it would be good for members such as him with a vast knowledge over many years of the Club to have a vote at the AGM. This was noted by the Commodore for further discussion by the Committee.

**Honorary Members** – both Kevin Harris and John Sibley were awarded Honorary Membership. Congratulations to both of them by all present!

#### **Other Proposals**

I won't go into too much detail for the following as they are on our website for further information if you need to know more but:

Proposal to replace S.3 Rules Membership – Paragraph 7 – "temporary membership". This was approved.

Proposal to approve the new role of RC Board Sports. This was approved with a proposed for co-opted member Alex. Proposal to amend S.8 Item 59 Sailing or Fishing boats stored on the Boat Park must be launched on our water from our beach at least three times per year (with more details regarding fees and insurance). This was approved Proposal for Subscriptions and Fees to be increased by 3% for 2024/25. This was approved.

I am delighted to update you on our fundraising for the Macmillan Charity for which the efforts of our Club members - led by Sue, who has been our RC Social and Fundraising member until yesterday, stood at £2,500.


